THE ABCs of PCSD

Do you ever find yourself wondering what in the world your child's teacher, principal, etc. is talking about when they refer to the CSE writing IEPs or SIPs sending information to DWEIC?

While this is not intended to be an exhaustive list, it is a quick reference guide to explain those acronyms we all use so freely. Some further clarification is offered for some of the less obvious acronyms.

ABE Adult Basic Education

> Offered to community members who do not have a high school diploma. May lead to a GED (general education diploma) completion.

ADD/ADHD Attention Deficit Disorder / Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder

> Terms used to refer to a family of related chronic neurobiological disorders that interfere with an individual's capacity to regulate activity level (hyperactivity), inhibit behavior (impulsivity), and attend to tasks (inattention) in developmentally appropriate ways. The core symptoms of ADHD include an inability to sustain attention and concentration, developmentally inappropriate levels of activity, distractibility, and impulsivity.

AED Automated External Defibrillator

Equipment used to assist in the application of CPR (coronary

pulmonary resuscitation)

Software system used to manage data relating to test scores and instructional programs for students receiving academic assistance

AIS Academic Intervention Services
