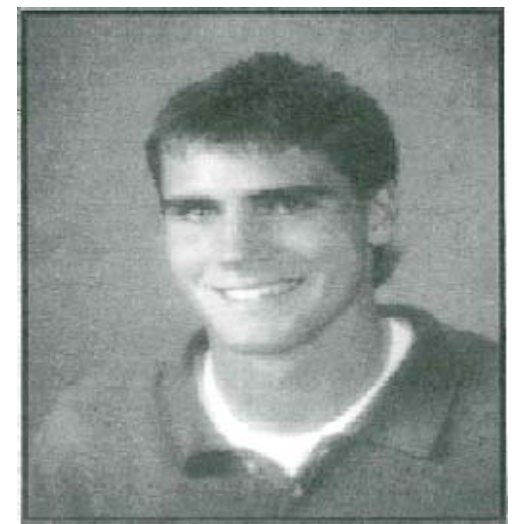
Pete Sullivan coached varsity soccer at PHS for 26 years. Under his tenure, his teams accumulated 296 wins, ten Section VII championships and four state quarter-final appearances. He was also named CVAC Coach of the Year on several occasions. Many of Coach Sullivan's players went on to successful careers at the collegiate level, especially at Division III. Coach Sullivan was an innovator who helped bring the level of play in Section VII, from a rugged, physical style to a game of finesse and foot skills. His teams were known for their precision passing, ball control and exceptional fitness level. Never looking for an easy way, Coach Sullivan always scheduled a challenging pre-season schedule that included the best teams from Vermont and the Albany area. Before he began his coaching career, Pete Sullivan was an outstanding basketball player at SUNY Plattsburgh and has been very involved in numerous youth sports throughout his life. Pete retired from the City School District after serving 37 years in the Guidance Office. He is married to Mary Ellen (Gorman) Sullivan. They have four sons, Peter, Steve, Keith and Kevin.

Mike Deloria was a multi-sport athlete. He played three years of varsity hockey and was a CVAC All-Star for two seasons and CVAC Most Valuable Player in his senior year. He was also named Black Letter Winner for hockey that same year. In football, Deloria was named a CVAC All-Star for 2 years while leading PHS to an undefeated season in his junior year. Baseball was pretty much the same, as he was selected a CVAC All-Star in his junior and senior year. Mike continued his hockey career at SUNY Plattsburgh where he played four years and was a member of the 1981 and 1982 NCAA National Finalist teams. A graduate of SUNY Plattsburgh, he is presently an independent financial advisor for Donlan and Barcomb. He is married to PHS graduate Kristen (Ryan) Deloria. They have three children, Lauren, Hallie and Sara.

Matt Flynn, one of PHS's finest all around athletes, captained all three of his teams to Section VII championships. As a goalie in soccer, he was named the CVAC Most Valuable Player leading PHS to the State Tournament. As one of the many great PHS point guards over the years, Matt directed the Hornets in one of the biggest upsets in Section VII history. His outstanding defense on a player 6 inches taller, provided PHS with another title. Baseball, though, was his real claim to fame. As a catcher, he was the spark to take PHS to two consecutive State Final Fours. His athleticism and leadership was recognized by the CVAC coaches, who named him MVP of his senior year. That same year, along with fellow inductee Gus Terry, he was named most Outstanding Athlete of 1996. A graduate of Rollins College, Matt continued to enjoy his love of sports while playing four more years of baseball. He is married to Brooklyn Flynn and they have two children, Layla and Jenna.

Gus Terry is considered one of the best pitchers to have ever worn the Black and Orange. As a sophomore, he no-hit Tupper Lake and as a senior, he set a PHS record of 19 strikeouts against Ticonderoga. The dominant pitcher in the Section for two years, Terry was no slouch at the plate, hitting over .400 for his career. He was a three year starter in soccer, hockey and baseball. He attained CVAC First Team All-Star in all three sports. Many also remember Gus' great spirit and true love in playing any game. Along with Matt Flynn, Gus was also named Most Outstanding Athlete his senior year. Gus attended College of Saint Rose where he attained the following Awards/Honors: 5th All-Time Wins, 3rd All-Time Strikeouts, 1999 and 2000 (NYCAC) First Team, 2000 NCAA Regional Tournament MVP, led College of Saint Rose to first and only NCAA Division II College World Series in 2000, Montgomery, AL. As a sophomore, in 1999, he was 22nd in the country for strikeouts/9 innings. As a junior, in 2000, he was 14th in the country for strikeouts/9 innings. In 2002, Gus played professional baseball in Girona, Spain for the El Llano Baseball Club. Gus is married to Katie (Castine) Terry and they have one child, Grace.

A graduate of Brandeis University, Sarah played four years of soccer and captained the team in her senior year. Presently she is a Youth Advocate in Minneapolis, Minnesota.
