

Debbie Burns (Davis) Class of 2003

A three-sport athlete in the early 2000s for PHS, Debbie played varsity soccer, basketball and softball

and was voted Most Athletic and Most School Spirit by her peers.

As a soccer player, she was a center mid-fielder and stopper, marking the opposition's top scorer and staying true to her nickname of Debbie "Defense" Davis. Davis captained the team to the Section 7 title in 2003, received the Black Letter, and was also a CVAC All Star.

On the basketball court, Debbie took the helm as point guard and led the team in points and assists her senior year, averaging 14ppg and 8 assists/pg.

A CVAC All Star in both of her varsity seasons, Davis also received the Black Letter award from her teammates. With a three-year run on varsity softball, Davis was a dominant catcher in the league, allowing only a handful of stolen bases in her three seasons.

An asset at the plate as well, Davis batted clean up, with a .380 in her career and was named to the CVAC All Star team all three seasons. Debbie went on to play soccer and basketball at CCC, where she captained the 2003 soccer team to the first undefeated season in school history and helped her team reach the final four both seasons. Davis finished out her collegiate career as the point guard of the Plattsburgh State Women's Basketball team, where she graduated in 2007. After working in Finance in the Boston area upon graduation, Debbie returned to Plattsburgh in 2011 to launch a photography business, Jared and Debbie Photography, which she runs with her husband, Jared. The couple has two young children, Clayton and Kate.

The PHS Athletic Hall of Fame

The Plattsburgh High School Athletic Hall of Fame was started in 1993, and inducted its first class in October 1994. Individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the PHS athletic program and, in some cases, at both the college and professional levels through their participation as athletes, coaches or administrators, are inducted annually at an Induction Dinner as part of the Homecoming Weekend every fall.

Casey Flynn Class of 1977

Casey Flynn was a standout for some great Hornet teams in the mid-1970s. After transferring from St. John's, Flynn was a member of the Football, Basketball and Baseball teams at PHS. Flynn quarterbacked the 1976 PHS CVAC Co-Champions. With Flynn at the helm, the Hornets finished 7-1 for their first title in six years; receiving All-CVAC recognition after that season.

Teamed with fellow Hornet Hall of Famer Joe Cardany in the backcourt, Flynn helped lead the Hornets to a sectional title in basketball. Casey was also a solid cen-

terfielder for the Hornet baseball teams, winning two more Sectional titles. Flynn received All-Star recognition for his efforts. He hit .375 for his four-year career (including one year at St. Johns). Flynn played some of the most important positions during a highly successful period of Hornet sports.

He graduated from the University of Maryland in 1981, has retired from MetLife, and lives in Plattsburgh with his wife Beth. They have three children, Kate, Molly and Krissy.

Steve Garrow

Class of 1982

Steve Garrow, '82, was a record-setting member of the Hornet Football team. A key member of the Hornets Championship team in 1981, Garrow was an All-Star kicker and halfback. He capped off his stellar football career by being named the Most Valuable Offensive Player in the 1981 Super Bowl win over Saranac Lake, receiving the Black Letter Award for the season.

To this day, Garrow is the All-Time leader in points scored for the Hornet Football team.


Garrow also participated for four years with the Hor-

nets Track & Field team. During his senior year he was able to make it to the NY State Championships held at Cornell University for the high jump and 4X4 relay.

In 1983, Steve married his high school sweetheart, Holly McRoberts. The following year he joined the U.S. Army and was stationed at Fort Bragg, NC. He received his honorable discharge in 1990. After leaving the Army, Steve worked in the beverage industry and received a Business degree from Clinton Community College.

In 1998, Steve and his family moved to Virginia, where he opened his own business which has been successful for over 20 years. In 2009, Garrow moved his family and business back to his roots and the beautiful city of Plattsburgh.



Leigh Ryan Class of 1989

Leigh Ryan, '89, was a three-sport star for the Lady Hornets in the late 1980s. She won 12 Varsity letters while participating in Swimming, Basketball and Softball.

In the pool, Ryan began her Hornet career as an 8th grader in the fall of 1984. Ryan excelled for the Hornets for 5 years and held the school record in the 100 breaststroke at the time of her graduation. Ryan was also a solid performer for the Lady Hornets on the basketball court. She led the CVAC in scoring as a junior and was a member of the CVAC All-Star



team. As a member of the Hornets Softball team for 4 years, Ryan was a standout pitcher.

Ryan lives in Plattsburgh and works for Chazy Central School. She continues to officiate many local sports. She has two children, Cassidy and Riley.



Matt Meyers Class of 1996

Matt Meyers, '96, was a three-sport star for the Hornets in the '90s. He was named the Most Valuable Athlete at PHS in 1996. As a football player, Matt was a strong safety, tight end, punter and kicker for the Hornets.

In 1995 he was a co-captain and co-recipient of the Black Letter award. He was named to the Coaches All-Star teams in 1994 and 1995. Matt was a four-year player for the PHS Hockey team and ended his spectacular career as the Hornets all-time leading scorer with 124 points.

He was a 1995-96 1st Team CVAC All-Star.

Meyers was also an outstanding baseball player for the Hornets. In 3 seasons he posted a 17-0 pitching record and batted over .450 for his career. He was named to the CVAC All-Star team each of this three seasons. He was a member of the Hornet team that made it to the NY State Final Four two years in a row. He pitched a 2 hitter in 1995 to help the team advance to the Final Four. Meyers also played three years of American Legion baseball. He later attended SUNY Oneonta where he played baseball for the Red Dragons for four seasons.

Matt is presently a Senior Manager of Safety Management System Data Analysis at Atlas Air Inc. He is married to Joan (Cowan) Meyers from Copake. They have two children, Alexander and Andrew.
