Mark Haubner was one of the finest athletes PHS produced during the 1980's. Haubner was a double threat for the Hornets, starring in basketball and football. He played 3 years at the varsity level in both sports, winning two Black Letter Awards in basketball. Mark was also voted as Team Captain two times. He was a member of the CVAC All-Star team two times and played on the Hornets 1986 Section 7 Championship team. On the football field, Haubner excelled as the starting quarterback for the Hornets. He holds several team passing records to this day including Most Career Passing Yards and Most Completions. He also holds the Single

Season records for pass completions and passing yards.

Mark was Valedictorian of the Class of '88 and went on to receive a
Bachelor of Arts degree from Amherst College. Haubner is currently the
Director of Software Production Management for FOX Sports in Los
Angeles. He and his wife Julie have two small children, Theo and Nina.







DAVE LAMORA – CLASS OF 1964 Presented by: Chris Rowlson


Dave LaMora was one of the best athletes in the Champlain Valley League in the early 60's for the Hornets. On the football field, LaMora quarterbacked Coach John Williams' team for 3 years, leading them to an 18-6 record and a CVL title in 1961. His leadership qualities and instincts were instrumental in this very prosperous period of PHS football. Dave still ranks in the Top 10 in points scored for the Hornets, scoring 26 touchdowns. His exploits were well known in a time when four very good football teams played within the City limits.


On the basketball court, Dave played for Coach George Kimball on some of the best hoop teams PHS has ever had going a remarkable 45-10 in his three years with the team. The Hornets won 3 Championships during this time. LaMora was a winner and hard-nosed competitor. Over the years, Dave has participated in the Relay for Life and has been instrumental in fund raising for the Children's Miracle Network.

Dave retired from Department of Corrections after 27 years and spends most of his free time golfing and spending time with his family, his wife Susan, their 3 daughters Amy, Lizabeth and Christina and 5 grandchildren.









Tom Neale '87 was one of the finest baseball players to ever wear the Orange & Black. Neale was a 3-time CVAC All-Star and was selected the CVAC Player of the Year in 1987. He was also a member of the Hornet basketball team for 2 years. He won the prestigious Merritt C. Clifford Athletic Award and Black Letter Award in his senior year.

After graduation, Neale attended the College of Saint Rose where he compiled a 26-9 record during his career. He was selected to the Saint Rose All-Time Baseball Team in 1998 and won the first ever Coaches Award in 1990.

Neale's love for baseball continued after college as he went on to coach Clinton Community College for 20 years. He also served as a coach for Plattsburgh Minor League and Little League for 5 years. Tom also continued to pitch in the Northern League where he was voted Pitcher of the Year in 1990.

Neale is a member of the Breakfast Kiwanis Club of Plattsburgh and is a Program Committee Member of Cornell Cooperative Extension in Plattsburgh.

Tom enjoys his current position as Education Coordinator, working with children for the last 21 years at the Ted K. Center for the Plattsburgh Housing Authority. He and his wife Suzanne reside in Plattsburgh and are the proud parents of two girls Karlie and Lexie.
